Dear Mayor Brown:

The purpose of this letter is to certify the results of the elections conducted by the Board of Personnel Appeals on April 26, 1974 to determine the representative for collective bargaining purposes for employees of the City of Missoula.

In the unit of Library employees there were twenty (20) employees eligible to vote of which nineteen (19) valid ballots were cast. Eighteen (18) ballots were cast in favor of representation by the Retail Clerks International Association, Local #991; one (1) ballot was cast for No Representation.

In the unit of clerical and meter department employees there were twenty-three (23) employees eligible to vote of which seventeen (17) valid ballots were cast. Sixteen (16) ballots were cast in favor of representation by the Retail Clerks International Association, Local #991; one (1) ballot was cast in favor of No Representation.

There being a clear majority in each unit, the Board of Personnel Appeals does hereby certify the Retail Clerks International Association, Local #991 as the EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE for collective bargaining purposes of the metermaids, meter maintenance men, office and clerical personnel employed by the City of Missoula; and of the Library personnel, including the library secretarial position, employed by the City of Missoula.

The Rules and Regulations of the Board of Personnel Appeals provide that:

"24-3.8(6)-8860(5) Contracts (a)—one copy of each collective bargaining contract between a public employer and a labor organization shall be filed with the Board within thirty (30) days after the final execution thereof."
