The results of the election conducted by the Board of Personnel Appeals on January 21, 1987, to determine the representative for collective bargaining purposes for certain employees of Roundup Elementary School District 55 and Roundup High School District 5-H, are as follows:

46	-	eligible voters
39	-	valid votes cast
32	-	Ballots for Representation by Montana Education Association
7	-	No Representation
1	-	challenged ballot

There being a clear majority, the Board hereby certifies Montana Education Association/National Education Association as the exclusive representative for collective bargaining purposes for all classified employees including but not limited to those classified as nurse, tutor, aide, clerk, secretary, cook, helper, assistant, driver, custodian, and housekeeper excluding persons employed on a casual or substitute basis for less than thirty (30) days, and all other employees specifically the principal, school district clerk, principals, and members of the teacher's bargaining unit.
